For Students, By Students **Bookstore Shortages**



It's well into the fall semester here at Forsyth Tech, and some students The Forsyth Tech Bookstore has recently been out of stock on textbooks for some popular classes, most notably ENG 111 and BIO 111. This has been a major inconvenience to some book-less students. Tests and homework inevitably come their scattered throughout the way.

"I tried buying my BIO 111 books before class even started. It's been four weeks at this point, and that's a little ridiculous. I have a lab test coming up soon, and I'm totally unprepared," says Kara Miller, 21, an Associate in the Arts Major.

According to the Forsyth Tech Bookstore, there are currently issues on the publisher's end of the spectrum. Forsyth Tech is in so smart on the publisher's still don't have their books. the process of switching to "custom books," which take around 2-4 weeks to print on demand and then 7-10 business days to get to the school. These custom books are made specifically for Forsyth Tech students, including certain excerpts and side notes text.

Since the books are tailored specifically to Forsyth Tech students, the bookstore tries not to buy too many copies of a certain book. "We could buy one-hundred copies of a custom version of Beowulf. If we sell thirty of those one-hundred, then we have seventy books that end up collecting dust on the rack," said Danielle Hawkins, Customer Service Tech in the bookstore. "It's side of things, but it's really hard on our end."

The bookstore has a small window in which it is able to return the custom books, for about 10% return on the purchase.

Students may keep up with the list of out-of-stock books by logging into their Techlink accounts.
