## Complete Forsyth Tech Admissions Application.

## Submit Transcripts.

- High School or GED
- All Colleges where program related courses were completed

## Minimum English & Math Requirements

Must be ready to take ENG-111 and MAT-143 without a co-requisite course by having completed past ENG and MAT courses, High School unweighted GPA 2.5 or higher, test scores, associate or bachelor's degree.

### 1. Complete an application to Forsyth Tech

**Currently enrolled students** do not need to submit a new application.

### 2. Submit official transcripts

**-emailed copies from you are NOT official**

#### **We must have:**

- Official college transcripts where related classes were taken. Only undergraduate classes through bachelor's degree level, we do not need graduate level transcripts.
- Official AP scores from College Board if you want credit for applicable classes (credits showing on other college transcripts do not count).
- It is recommended to submit your graduating High School (or GED) transcript, or you may miss placement requirements.

### 3. Check that you meet the minimum readiness levels

All Health Program applicants are required to demonstrate English and Mathematics college readiness. You must be able to demonstrate that you have achieved the appropriate readiness levels in both areas by **at least one** of the following methods (**If you are unsure whether you meet either of these requirements, it is YOUR responsibility to speak with your assigned advisor PRIOR TO submitting your MAR application**):

**When we receive the MAR application, it will be reviewed to ensure you meet the minimum requirements. If you do *not* meet these requirements, you will not be eligible, you will be notified and will not be placed into the applicant pool.**

If applying to more than one program (you can apply to up to three programs at a time) be sure that you have checked the MAR packet for that program to ensure that you meet the minimum requirements and have taken the necessary related courses.

At your Pre-Program Advising and Planning meeting, a Medical Assisting faculty advisor will share information about the program layout, required courses, and minimum qualifications. When a student's results indicate readiness for Fall program entry, the faculty advisor will provide a personalized MAR eligibility tracking form. This form does not guarantee acceptance into the Medical Assisting program. It is designed to meet the mission of Forsyth Tech by providing a guided pathway for program completion and student success.

If a student does not yet meet the criteria for entering the program, the faculty advisor will provide a plan for the following semester and will schedule an appointment for further advising. All students will be guided as they progress toward program entry and program completion. Students are responsible for completing the MAR application as soon as they are eligible.

#### **6. Review additional requirements for accepted students**

##### **Program Orientation**

Orientation for Medical Assisting will be scheduled for a date after the Final Review Deadline. Students will register for Medical Assisting classes and learn more about clinical requirements during orientation.

##### **Clinical Clearance**

Students admitted to Medical Assisting will be required to meet additional clinical requirements to maintain their seat in the program. These requirements include a health assessment, physical, criminal background check and drug screening, TB testing, and the required vaccinations for a clinical practicum. **Accepted students will receive the necessary paperwork, instructions, and deadlines during the program orientation.**

## **PROGRAM ACCREDITATION INFORMATION**

**Forsyth Tech's Medical Assisting Program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs, 9355-113th St. N, #7709, Seminole, FL 33775, (727) 210-2350 (www.caahep.org), upon recommendation of the Medical Assisting Education Review Board (MAERB).**

Beginning with the January 2001 administration of the AAMA certification examination, applicants who have been found guilty of a felony or pleaded guilty to a felony will not be eligible to sit for the certification examination. Students may request the opportunity to submit written evidence/request a hearing before the certifying board of the AAMA in order to obtain a waiver.
