Beginner's Quilting Class: Layer Cake Shuffle Quilt



Description:

Have you always wanted to make a quilt but weren't sure where to start? In this beginner-friendly class, you'll learn the fundamentals of quilting while making the **Layer Cake Shuffle Quilt**, a fun and versatile pattern that's perfect for beginners! We'll cover essential skills such as:

- Understanding quilting materials and tools
- Reading a quilt pattern
- Cutting and piecing fabric accurately
- Making half-square triangles
- Pressing and trimming for precise blocks
- Assembling your quilt top step-by-step
- Creating a quilt sandwich with different basting methods
- Straight-line quilting with a walking foot
- Binding your quilt for a polished finish

Bring your sewing machine and supplies, and get ready to sew! Each class will include instruction followed by hands-on sewing time with guidance. By the end of the course, you'll have a beautiful quilt to take home!

Skill Level: Beginner (some sewing machine experience recommended)

Supply List:

Fabric & Materials:

- Layer Cake Shuffle Quilt Pattern (free pattern found at https://www.fatquartershop.com/layer-cake-shuffle-quilt-pattern-free-pdf-pattern-fat-quarter-shop).
- 1 Layer Cake (or forty-two 10" squares). Can be found online at shops such as www.fatquartershop.com/layer-cakes, www.missouriquiltco.com/collections/quilting-layer-cakes or at local quilt shops like Sew Original (Winston-Salem) or Sewingly Yours (Lewisville).
- 1 ½ yards of background fabric (for half-square triangles & additional piecing)
- ½ yard for binding
- 3 ½ yards for backing
- **Batting** (Twin-size or at least 60" x 72"). Feel free to wait to purchase, as we'll discuss various types of batting during class.

Sewing & Quilting Tools:

- Sewing machine with a 1/4" presser foot (and a walking foot for quilting)
- Rotary cutter with a sharp blade
- Self-healing cutting mat
- Acrylic quilting ruler (square ruler at least 8 ½" x 8 ½" for this project, but 12 ½" x 12 ½" is more versatile for future projects. If you can get two rulers, also having a 6 ½ " by 24" ruler is ideal.)
- Iron and ironing board (or wool pressing mat)
- Straight pins or clips
- Seam ripper
- Fabric scissors
- Thread (100% cotton, neutral color recommended)
- Marking tool (pencil, chalk pencil, or fabric marking pen)
- **Basting materials** (We will discuss various options in class, including safety pins, spray baste, and fusible batting)
- Binding clips (optional but helpful)

Course Outline & Structure

Recommended Schedule:

- Total number of classes: 6 sessions
- Class length: 2 hours per session (allows for instruction and hands-on sewing)
- Total course duration: 6 weeks

Week 1: Introduction & Getting Started

- What is quilting? Overview of materials and tools
- Understanding quilt patterns & fabric requirements
- Demonstration: Rotary cutting basics, how to cut straight lines, sewing a straight ¼" seam
- Hands-on: Marking, sewing, and cutting fabric for the quilt

Homework: Finish cutting all pieces

Week 2: Piecing & Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

- Introduction to piecing:
- Making Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)
- Pressing techniques: When to press seams open vs. to the side
- Trimming blocks for accuracy

Homework: Finish HSTs and trimming

Week 3: Block Assembly

- Arranging blocks and layout planning
- Sewing blocks into rows
- Pressing and aligning seams
- Sewing rows together into a completed quilt top

Homework: Finish assembling the quilt top

Week 4: Borders (optional) & Basting

- (Optional) Measuring, cutting, and adding a border
- · Quilt sandwich basics: backing, batting, and top
- Basting methods: pin basting, spray basting, fusible batting

Homework: Finish basting at home if not completed in class

Week 5: Quilting the Quilt

- Introduction to straight-line quilting
- Setting up the walking foot
- · Planning quilting lines & marking if needed
- Hands-on quilting

Homework: Finish quilting the quilt

Week 6: Binding & Finishing

- Measuring, cutting, and sewing binding strips
- · Attaching binding to the quilt
- Finishing techniques: hand-stitching vs. machine stitching
- Final showcase & celebration!
